2026 Update

We are proud to continue offering meaningful, practical, and compassionate support to sarcoma patients and their families across Ireland. So far in 2026, we've been able to provide:

- 34 financial grants to adult sarcoma patients in the Republic of Ireland
- 103 one-to-one counselling sessions with our dedicated professional counsellors
- 7 online support groups, providing a safe and understanding space for patients to connect each month
- 7 bereavement support groups, helping families and loved ones navigate loss
- 2 in-person support groups held in Cork and Limerick, bringing patients and family members together to share experiences and support one another

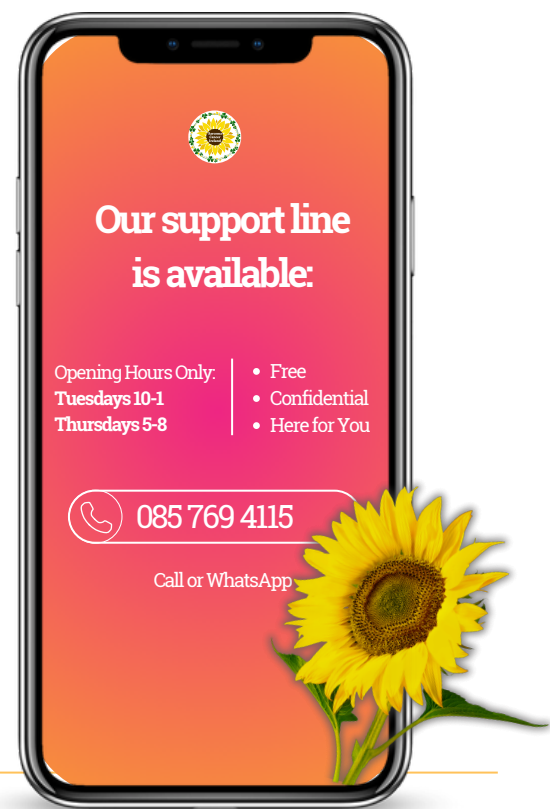

Launch of Our Strategic Plan 2026–2028

On **Rare Disease Day, 28th February**, Sarcoma Cancer Ireland proudly launched our **Strategic Plan 2026–2028**, setting out an ambitious roadmap for the next three years and reaffirming our commitment to improving outcomes for everyone affected by sarcoma.

The plan focuses on strengthening patient and family support services, increasing awareness of sarcoma among both the public and healthcare professionals, enhancing advocacy efforts, improving collaboration with medical teams, and ensuring the lived experiences of patients and families remain at the heart of everything we do.

As a charity founded and led by patients and carers, we are committed to building a future where every person affected by sarcoma receives the support, understanding and care they deserve.

Launch of Two New Family Support Grants

In June, we were delighted to announce the launch of two new support grants designed to provide practical and emotional assistance to families affected by sarcoma.

Our new **Play Therapy Funding Grant** will help children whose parent has been diagnosed with sarcoma access accredited play therapy services. A cancer diagnosis can have a significant impact on children, and this support aims to provide a safe space where they can express their emotions and build resilience during a difficult time.

We also introduced a **Funeral Grant**, providing a once-off payment of €500 to eligible families following the loss of a loved one to sarcoma. The grant is intended to ease some of the financial pressures families may face during bereavement.

These new initiatives reflect our belief that sarcoma affects entire families, not just the individual diagnosed. By expanding our support services, we hope to ensure that families receive compassionate and meaningful support when they need it most.

SPAGN Conference

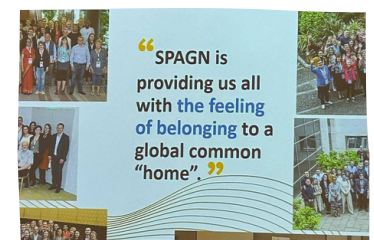
In early May, board members Carol, Kelli and Catherine travelled to Sweden to attend the 2026 SPAGN (Sarcoma Patient Advocacy Global Network) Conference, proudly representing the Irish sarcoma community on an international stage.

The conference brought together sarcoma patient advocacy organisations from around the world, alongside leading oncologists, researchers and healthcare professionals, to discuss the latest developments in sarcoma treatment, research and patient support.

It was an invaluable opportunity to learn from other patient organisations, share experiences and ideas, and strengthen the relationships that help drive progress for sarcoma patients globally. Hearing about the innovative ways other groups are supporting their communities was both inspiring and motivating.

The conference also provided encouraging updates on advances in sarcoma research, emerging therapies and new treatment approaches. These developments give hope that we are moving closer to more effective treatments and better outcomes for people affected by sarcoma.

We would also like to thank the wonderful ladies of the **Horseleap Irish Countrywomen's Association**, who raised an incredible €1,220 through their line dancing classes.

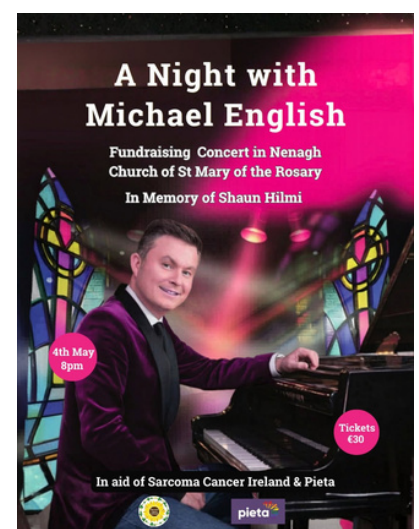
