2025 Update

We are proud to continue offering meaningful, practical, and compassionate support to sarcoma patients and their families across Ireland. So far in 2025, we've been able to provide:

- 34 individual counselling sessions with our two dedicated professional counsellors
- 25 financial grants of €500 each for adult sarcoma patients in the Republic of Ireland
- Monthly online support sessions, including: a sarcoma patient support session led by Ann and a bereavement support session led by Peter
- In-person peer support groups in Dublin and Cork
- A pilot program for AYA (Adolescent and Young Adult) patients in Dublin and Cork, offering Just Eat vouchers to those undergoing long hospital stays

We're also working to expand our peer support groups nationwide, ensuring more patients and families have access to community and connection, no matter where they live.

Whether you're newly diagnosed, in treatment, recovering, or supporting someone with sarcoma, you are not alone.

ESMO Conference

The 2025 ESMO Sarcoma and Rare Cancers Congress took place from 20–22 March in Lugano, Switzerland. Representatives from Sarcoma Cancer Ireland were proud to attend and deliver a presentation on the importance of patient advocacy.

Bringing together top oncologists, researchers, pathologists, patient advocates, and other healthcare professionals, the congress fostered lively discussions and collaborations aimed at improving outcomes for people living with sarcomas and rare cancers.

SPAGN Conference

From 11–13 April 2025, the global sarcoma advocacy community gathered in Washington, DC, for the 15th SPAGN Annual Conference.

Over 120 patient advocates, medical experts, and partner organisations from nearly 30 countries came together to connect, learn, and collaborate — including representatives from Sarcoma Cancer Ireland.

The conference highlighted the critical importance of cross-border collaboration, knowledge exchange, and patient involvement in every aspect of sarcoma care and research. 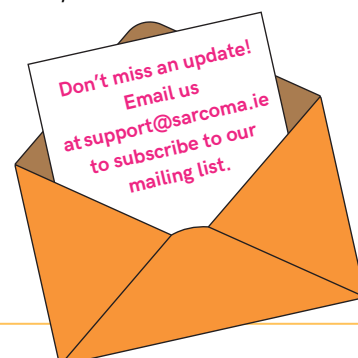
